2) Giving to God means giving our best to Him 22:29-30a, Deuteronomy 17:1, 1 Chronicles 21:22a, 24b, Exodus 35:21-22, 29a, Exodus 36:3b, 6-7, Haggai 1:4-5, 8-9, Luke 12:15-21, Proverbs 11:24 New Living Translation)
3) Giving is for everyone. (Mark 12:41-44, 2 Corinthians 8:12, Philippians 4:19)
