Sacrament is the Latin word "Sacramentum," meaning "an oath (vow) of allegiance, a consecration, a solemn obligation or a holy act."

- III. JESUS FULFILLS PASSOVER (Exodus 12:3-14, 1 Corinthians 5:7b, John 1:29, 1 Peter 1:18-19)

We celebrate Jesus, the Passover Lamb, Who died for us.

1)	Blood was shed and put on the doorposts of the house so God's judgment and death for sin would pass over. (Exodus 12:13)	
	Jesus, God's firstborn Son, shed His blood and received the punishment God's judgment required and we deserved. HE is the slain. If we sin, we ask God to wash us clean by the blood of Jesus. When He sees the blood, the "death angel" (deserved judgment) passes over us. (Revelation 13:8b)	
2)	The Passover Lamb was inspected for four days—the lamb was to be spotless. (Exodus 12:5-6) Jesus was "inspected" for four days. Pilate said, "I find no fault in Him." (John 18:38, John 19:4,6)	
3)	A lamb was ordained for every house. (Exodus 12:3). We all need to receive Him. (Acts 16:31)	
4)	4) The whole lamb was to be consumed. (Exodus 12:10)	
	Don't settle for less than the FULL provision of the Cross.	
5)	The Passover meal provided healing and strength. (Psalm 105:37, John 6:35, 1 Peter 2:24)	
6)	Following the Passover meal, Israel was to flee from Egypt in haste. (Exodus 12:11,33) Egypt is a type of the world.
